What is CNP?

The Certificate in Native Plants (CNP) program is designed to expand your knowledge of botany, ecology, conservation and the use of native flora in the southeastern United States. Students will receive both classroom education and hands on application to increase knowledge and skills that can be applied at home, in the community, and at work. The course setting will provide a common ground for native plant enthusiasts to meet and connect with others who share their interests. The program is designed to benefit both home gardeners and landscape professionals.

CNP Partnerships

The Certificate in Native Plants (CNP) program represents a partnership between three native plant education and conservation non-profit organizations: **Tennessee Valley Chapter of Wild Ones**, **Reflection Riding Arboretum & Nature Center** and the **Tennessee Native Plant Society**. Members of these organizations will receive discounts on class fees, but participation in CNP is not limited and open to the public.
